## WHAT IS PEDIATRIC OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY?

Pediatric occupational therapy prioritizes providing client-centered services that are meaningful, appropriate, motivating, and aligned with the child's goals (O'Brien & Kuhaneck, 2019).

Examples of some diagnoses that pediatric OTs work with:

- Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD)
- Cerebral Palsy (CP)
- Down Syndrome
- Sensory Integration Disorder (SID)
- Attention-deficit/hyperactivity disorder (ADHD)



## **HOW CAN OT HELP?**

- Provide evidence-based researchsupported interventions and strategies.
  - Emotional regulation
  - Oral motor/feeding
  - Handwriting
- Educate and equip caregivers, teachers, and interprofessionals on strategies.
- Evaluate, treat, and assess children to address their development milestones.
